Government Care of Millionaires

The New York Post recalls the incident of the transfer of the old New York custom house property to the and presents figures showing that it was virtually a gift:

This transaction is understood to have followed a magnificent contribution to Mr. Hanna's plethoric campaign fund in 1896. It has been said City National Bank for \$3,250,000, that this property, now considered to be worth \$5,000,000, has been practically transferred to the bank by the skill of a bookkeeper, without the actual transfer of one solitary cent of money beyond the contribution to the campaign fund. It is said to have been the most marvelous transaction in history. The secretary of the treasury deposits with the bank from \$5,000,000 to \$15,000,000 of United States funds. The bank credits the government account with \$3,250,000, leaving an unpaid balance of \$15,000,000. "The government continues to occupy the building for ten years, paying the bank therefore \$15,000,000 a year. In the ten years the bank draws in rentals from the government \$1,500,000, and in interest on government deposits probably another million. In the meantime the government declines to even receive a credit for the \$15,000 balance on the building, thus saving for the bank, state and city taxes in ten years amounting to \$750,000, since the title does not pass from the government until that \$15,000,000 is paid."

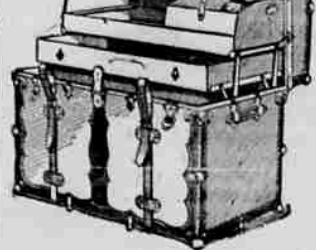
