

THE RAIN STORM CONTINUES

Cessation of the Almost Steady Downpour—Rivers and Creeks Bank High

The rain and wind storm which has been raging almost continuously about four days shows no signs of abatement, and today was about the worst yet. Last night the wind blew from the rain fell in torrents almost about a break.

As the result of the heavy rainfall rivers and creeks are all bank high and some of the smaller streams are full to overflowing.

Reports from different parts of the county indicate that the wind has done considerable damage in the way of blowing down fences and the rural telephone lines are down at various places. There is a break in the line between here and Astoria, on the coast, and it is impossible to get any information as to the effect of the storm on shipping on the river.

A schooner is reported ashore south of the mouth of the Siuslaw, but nothing can be learned about it.
