In other words, he has spent probably that amount for things going to the good of the city as a whole and not to the mayor as an individual. Mayor Ballinger is said to give not a little to charity. In fact, those who are in close touch with him at the city hall say that he daily goes down to his pocket and gives. Many subscription petitions for funds for benevolent purposes are presented first to the mayor, and his name heads the list and is taken for the purpose of influencing those to be approached later. This is a well-meant proposal, but it helps not a little to deplete the modest sum which the mayor under the city laws is privileged to take as his own from the public funds."
