LAND
DEAL
Over 1300 Acres on
Mohawk to Be
Sold
Dr. T. W. Harris and B. L. Bogart
Will Dispose of Their Hold-
ings at a Good
Figure

The sale of 1338 acres of fine timber and up the Mohawk, between 17 and 20 miles northeast of Eugene, and belonging to Dr. T. W. Harris and B. L. Bogart, of this city, is about to be made to the firm of Whitten & Bryant, of Portland, representing a wealthy Eastern man by the name of Lewis. Messrs. Whitten and Bryant returned to Portland today after having examined the land. The only hitch in the deal now is said to be the price. Messrs. Harris and Bogart ask \$15 an acre for the land, but the Portland firm is at present willing to pay only \$12. This matter may be settled, however, within a few days and the sale be completed.
 The timber on the land about to be sold is some of the best in the state and has the advantage of being only a short distance from the railroad. It lies in township 17, south of range 2 west, and is easy of access. The prospective purchasers are well pleased with the timber, as evidenced by the price they offer for it.
 It is said that if this sale for any reason is not completed another buyer is ready to take the land at once.
