The United Railways Company, of Portland, will probably build a system of electric railroads in this valley. Under present consideration this company is said to intend to build from Portland to Salem at once and will come to Eugene later on. It is said this company will probably extend its lines throughout this valley, making a complete network of electric lines. It is probable, and even contemplated, that this system will eventually be extended so the main line will traverse the rich country from Eugene to San Francisco.

PANAMA CANAL REPORT

Washington, Jan. 24.—The essential features of the minority report of the consulting engineers of the Panama canal, which is the one favored by Chief Engineer Steen and which probably will be adopted was made public today. It provides for a lock canal at an elevation of 85 feet with a flight of three locks on the Colon side and two on the Panama side. The cost is estimated at \$147,000,000, and it will take seven and a half years to construct it. One of the principal features is the dam at Catun to control the Chagres river and form a lake, the dam to be about 95 feet high and a quarter of a mile long.
