With the possibility of such disaster as overtook the Valencia trying to make entrance to Puget Sound, it will be asked why so many people travel up and down the coast by the ocean route. They take the more hazardous means of travel to save probably one-half the railroad fare.

John D. Rockefeller has given his Chicago university another million and a half. There were enough universities without the creation of one by money in plain terms largely stolen from the people, the accumulation of which has been marked with most ruthless competitive slaughter of independent concerns that had the temerity to engage in the oil business. Standard Oil would give oil away to break a competitor, but again with a free field it has never failed to put prices to a point that more than recouped it.

In three northern provinces of Japan 700,000 of the three million population are already on the paper list resultant from the failure of the rice crop the past season. There was too much rain and too little sunshine, and when harvest came there was nothing but shriveled heads. Perhaps it was akin to the crop failure here one season, when an excessive spring rainfall was followed by hot weather, and then rust came, sapping the beautiful appearing heads of grain and filling the heads that looked plump enough with shriveled grain, in few instances worth the harvesting. Seed wheat went to fancy prices the next seedling season, much of it being shipped in from California, the usual mixing of varieties in the mills, the only considerable supply of old wheat left, precluding its use for seed.
