A Public Necessity

The present source of Eugene's water supply is unsatisfactory, and it is necessary to have this remedied at once.

Municipal ownership may obtain for us a gravity system of pure mountain water, but it takes time to do these things, and our first duty to ourselves, to the state and to our families is to remedy the present condition. We believe the council should meet, but first agree to eliminate at this meeting all reference to the future and deal with the present crisis. With the bitter feeling in existence on the municipal ownership question between the members of the council, whenever this comes up before the body it means a wrangle and nothing accomplished.

What Eugene wants is immediate action and then the council can scrap the matter out.

We cannot wait two years for a good water supply, nor can we wait three months. It is the duty of the water company and the council to see that we have pure water in from 30 to 60 days. Hundreds of cases of sickness and numerous deaths are liable to occur if we wait. Give us immediate action on this pure water question and fight out the municipal ownership matter at the polls.

The Oregonian puts it very tersely: Everybody will be glad that Mr. Longworth is getting better. It will be really quite necessary that he be there. But it isn't his affair.

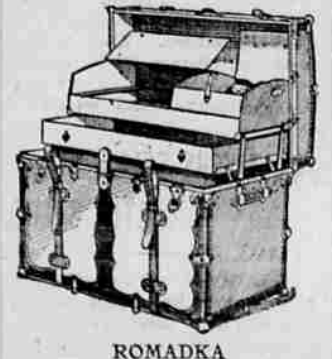
