TO EXIST

On Mrs. Erickson's Place Adjoining Coal Mine Property

Spencer Butte Coal and Petroleum Co. Has a Good Ledge of Coal

--Mrs Erickson Will Develop Newly Found Vein

G. W. Bell, of the firm of Wilcox & Bell, employment agents, yesterday visited the Spencer Butte Coal and Petroleum Co.'s coal mine on the old Richardson farm, ten miles southwest of Eugene. He says there is a very

good vein of coal there, several feet wide, and it is his opinion that a whole mountain of coal will be found.

On Mrs. Erickson's farm, adjoining the one on which the coal mine is located, Mr. Bell says, has been found a vein of gold and copper, which may possibly at some time in the future make the owner of the land independently rich. Mr. Bell says that assays of the ore have been made and it was found that it contained a good per cent. of gold and copper, in about equal parts.

Mrs. Erickson says she will have the property developed to see what extent the gold and copper-bearing quartz extends.
