From the same source we learn that in 1900 comparative deaths from typhoid fever were as follows:

Farm districts.....	41.3
City districts.....	15.8
Excess typhoid death rate among farmers.....	26.4

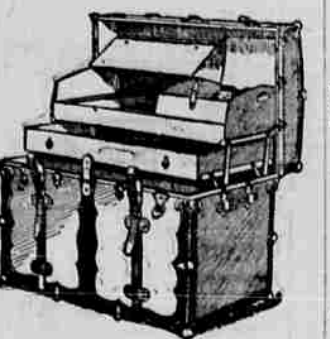
