It is getting time for building now, and the protected glass trust puts the screws to consumers with a ten per cent advance in the price of glass. Later, as consumption increases, there will be other advances.

There should be a thorough shaking up in the high priced sinucures of the department of commerce and labor. In November the government shipping map showing ocean lines from Pacific ports omitted those from Puget Sound, only to bungle again last month by leaving Portland lines out. It is San Francisco's turn.

He first climbed to the ridge of a barn, then slashed his throat with a razor and jumped off thirty-two feet to the ground, all without injury. The next day, while being taken to Spokane, he got away and jumped into the Little Spokane river, remaining there several hours. He was taken from the water in a state of collapse from cold and loss of blood.
