## A Potent Sire

Hiram Delaney, a wealthy bachelor farmer living four miles south of English, Indiana, awoke one morning last week in response to a stone thrown against his front door. As he opened the door his eyes bulged with astonishment, for there were eight babies, ranging from two weeks to one year, all nicely arranged in a row on a big spread and tucked in with blankets.

A note pinned on a coverlet bore this scrawl: "These are all your own care for them."  
Delaney yelled for his mother, who kept a house for him, and that worthy lady made haste to take in the youngsters and assure her son that he was not dreaming. Later on, however, they decided that it was a blackmailing plot, and requested the county officials to take charge of the foundlings. Delaney vehemently denies the paternity of these or any other babies.

Morrison Athey, the third white person born in Oregon, died Thursday morning at Portland. He was born across the river from Oregon City in 1844. His parents came with the first Dr. Whitman party in 1836.

Chancellor Von Bulow, who fainted in the German reichstag Thursday, had kept at his desk recently from eight in the morning till near midnight, incident to the settlement of the Moroccan entanglement. Most of our big American officials would faint if they had to put in half those hours.

September 3, 1834, over seventy years ago, James Snyder, who died at Lebanon the other day, was married to Mrs. Frelove Melissa Howe, who lived faithfully with him all those years and survives him. He was 93 years of age and had been a constant member of the Methodist church 67 years, 44 of which he was a class leader. Two of his sons entered the ministry. Eleven children, four sons and seven daughters, were born to them, eight of whom are living.

Another prophet come to grief, or rather the dupes who trusted him and put their money in his hands. Now that "Elijah" Dowie is discredited by his flock all sorts of bad things are being said about him, among others that at one time he had a hankering toward polygamy, giving the not very clear reason therefor that it was because of the "hardness of heart prevalent in Zion," also referring to a very excellent gentleman who had another man killed so he could get his wife, King David, that he "permitted the Jews to have more than one wife on account of the hardness of their hearts." We can't think the hardness of their hearts had much to do with it.
