The Guard has all day furnished the public with complete news of the San Francisco calamity. As fast as late received telegrams came in they were bulletined in front of the office, and hundreds of people surrounded the bulletin boards all day.

At 10:30 o'clock this morning an extra was issued from this office and copies were eagerly seized by many people on the streets.

As each batch of fresh news of the appalling disaster was received it spread on the streets like wildfire and immediately toward crowds of men swarmed to the Guard's bulletin board to get the full particulars.

Not since the assassinating of President McKinley have the people been so excited.

A number of the Guard extras were taken to the special train which passed through here this forenoon at 11:45 o'clock and they were quickly snapped up by the passengers who were anxious to learn the latest bit of late news.
