Shave, 15 cents; hair cut, 25 cents; shave and hair cut, 35 cents; shampoo, 25 cents; extra, 35 cents; set, 25 cents; beard trimming, 25 cents; face massage, 35 cents; head massage, 35 cents; razor, 25 cents; 10 cents; neck shaving, 5 cents; one or both of the latter two may be given free when the bill reaches 25 cents or over; shaving on holidays, 10 cents extra; shaving outside of shop, 10 cents.

The regular hours of opening shall be 7:30 a. m. to 8:00 p. m. except on Saturday, when the closing hour is changed to 10 p. m. Close shop at noon on the following holidays: New Years, Fourth of July, Thanksgiving and Christmas; on Decoration day closing hours between 10 a. m. and 3 p. m.
