CONTRACTS LET FOR STAR MAIL ROUTES

Capt A. F. Hurd Gets Eugene-Mapleton Route--Mound-Eugene and Eugene-Mirth Routes

The postoffice department has recently entered into contracts for carrying mail on three Lane county star routes as follows:
From Eugene by Elmira, Varian, Hale, Delphia, Walton, Meadow and Swisshome to Mapleton, 61 miles and back six times a week, to Amasa F. Hurd, of Florence for \$3240 per year. The time schedule is as follows: From May 16 to October 15, leave Eugene daily except Sunday at 6 a. m., arriving at Mapleton by 9 p. m. Leave Mapleton at 6 a. m., arriving at Eugene by 9 a. m. From October 16 to May 15, leave Eugene at 6 a. m., arriving at Mapleton in 24 hours. Leave Mapleton at 6 a. m., arriving at Eugene in 24 hours. The amount of bonds required is \$7000.
From Mound, by Panther, Crow and Madison to Eugene, 37.50 miles and back, three times a week, to Frank Holland, of Crow, for \$948 per year. Time schedule: Leave Mound Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 6 a. m., arriving at Eugene at 6:30 p. m. Leave Eugene Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays at 6 a. m., arriving at Mound at 6:30 p. m. The bond is \$2000. From Eugene to Mirth, ten miles, and back twice a week, to Herman C. Bjerke, of Mirth, for \$200 per year. Time schedule: Leave Eugene Tuesdays and Saturdays at 10 a. m., arriving at Mirth at 1 p. m. Leave Mirth Tuesdays and Saturdays at 2:30 p. m., arriving at Eugene at 5:30 p. m. The bond is \$400.
