A surgeon was summoned by phone from Eugene, and about twenty-four hours later Dr. Bartle arrived at Acme to care for the injured man. Two of the smaller toes were amputated and quite a large piece of bone removed. While it will be some time before Mr. Seymour can use his foot it is thought that he will eventually be able to walk without limping.
