HAYWARD

SIGNED UP FOR
TWO YEARS

Will Devote Entire Time During School Term To Training Athletes—Dan Kelly Will Compete Under Oregon Colors At Meet In Chicago

The athletic committee of the Associated Students of the University of Oregon today signed a contract with "Bill" Hayward, the athletic trainer, to keep him at the university during the entire school term for the next two years, beginning the first of next September. He will devote his entire time to athletics, keeping the men in condition for the various contests to be pulled off with other colleges during the year.

Hayward is considered one of the best trainers in the country, and the university is to be congratulated upon securing him again. Notre Dame and the University of Wisconsin both wanted him this year and offered splendid inducements. If he would come, but he wanted them both. Mrs. Hayward and their little son are here and they will make Eugene their home.

WILL REPRESENT OREGON.
Dan Kelly, the star athlete of the university, whom Hayward has brought out so well during the past year, will compete in the meet of the American Amateur Athletic Union at Chicago this summer under the colors of the University of Oregon and not of Multnomah Athletic Club, as at first announced. The Alumni Association has taken the matter up and it was decided this morning to raise funds to pay Kelly's expenses to the meet. A committee will at once begin soliciting, and the necessary amount will no doubt be raised quickly.

SALOON MEN WANT TO BUILD NEW TOWN

Proposition To Move From Cottage Grove To Divide, Just Across the Douglas County Line, and Run Town Wide Open

A generally circulated report has it that the saloon men and their sympathizers at Cottage Grove are said to be contemplating moving in a colony to Divide, some few miles south of Cottage Grove on the Douglas county line, and starting a new town for the purpose of drawing from Cottage Grove whatever trade is possible. The plant has been considerably improved since last season by the installation of a small gasoline engine for the operation of the graders and by a general renovation.

MRS. CORA A. COLLINS SEEKS A DIVORCE

Her Husband Beat Her and Was Arrested—Is Now In the Insane Asylum—She Asks for Custody of Children

Mrs. Cora A. Collins, whose husband, John T. Collins, was arrested at Wendling several weeks ago for beating her, the husband later attempting to commit suicide by swallowing corrosive sublimate, finally landing in the insane asylum, today instituted proceedings in the circuit court for divorce and for the custody of their minor children, Bernice, aged ten years, Golda M., aged six, and Mabel V., aged three. Collins and his wife were married at Wellington, Ariz., county, Ill., December 21, 1905, and came to Oregon three years later.

Mrs. Collins alleges that her husband has been guilty of cruel and inhuman treatment toward her in that he cursed and abused her, accused her of being intimate with other men, and in March, 1909, struck her and pulled her hair, since which time they have not lived together. Woodcock and Potter are the plaintiff's attorneys.
