NO TYPHOID EPIDEMIC EXISTS IN EUGENE

Report That Many Cases Exist is Entirely Without Foundation—City Physician and County Health Officer Make a Public Statement on the Matter.

During the past several weeks there have been reports circulated in Eugene to the effect that a large number of cases of typhoid fever exist here at the present and that new ones are reported daily. The report is entirely without foundation, as proven by the following communication:

To the General Public:—Inasmuch as it is generally rumored that we are having another scourge of typhoid fever, we wish to say that there have been but seven cases reported since the beginning of June, and only eleven since the beginning of March, and one of those was in the country. This is surely correct, because the law makes it necessary for every case to be reported to the county health officer within 24 hours after its discovery.

General News Notes

There is another male heir to the German throne. Crown Princess Cecilia, wife of Crown Prince Frederick, gave birth to a son on July 4 at the marble palace at Potsdam. Mother and child are doing well.

Judge W. W. McCreadie, of the superior court of the state of Washington, has rendered a decision giving Hill a complete victory over Harriman in the contest for the right-of-way for the north bank road along the Columbia.

Two thousand saloon licenses at \$50 each have already been taken out in San Francisco.

W. J. Bryan was the central figure in the Independence day dinner at London Wednesday, at which 500 guests were present. Ambassador Reid and Mr. Bryan made the principal speeches, which were non-political.

President Roosevelt delivered a short address to a large crowd at the Oyster Bay Fourth of July celebration.

At Clatskanie, Or., F. L. Harding was killed by the premature explosion of a bomb, which he had manufactured, using a new smokeless powder made from a published receipt. The bomb, a piece of lead pipe, exploded during the process of making, horribly mutilating Harding.

Admiral Rojestvensky and several of his fellow officers are on trial at Cronstadt, charged with surrendering the Russian fleet unnecessarily at the battle of the Sea of Japan. The admiral takes all the blame upon himself and asks that his subordinates be excused. The penalty is death.
