SEVERAL SITES SUGGESTED FOR NEW POSTOFFICE

Shelly and Henderson Residence
Properties and Old Feed Barn
Corner Said to Be in Market—
Southwest Corner of West Eighth
and Olive Streets Mentioned

The postoffice department is advertising for a lot on which to erect the new federal building in Eugene, for which congress has recently appropriated \$50,000. Several sites have been suggested, any one of which would be satisfactory to a majority of the people, although some think that one or two would be too far away from the business center of the city.

It is understood bids have been or will be put in for the sale of the Shelly residence property at West Eighth and Charnell streets, the Henderson residence property at East Eighth and Pearl streets, and the feed barn property at Tenth and Willamette streets. Another site that has been suggested is the quarter block at West Eighth and Olive streets, occupied by McFarland's blacksmith and lodging house buildings, the Eugene steam laundry and other small structures. This is the most centrally located of any of those mentioned.

In case none of the bids are considered reasonable by the department all of them will be rejected and the government selects a suitable site, brings condemnation proceedings and the court sets a price on the land, the same method of procedure that is employed by railroad companies where they cannot buy the right-of-way for their tracks.

CONTRACT FOR COOS BAY LINE TO BE LET

Portland Oregonian: Advice is expected here any day of the letting of the contract for the construction of the first 40 miles of the Drain-Coos Bay branch of the South Pacific. Word has been received from San Francisco that the bids are being figured up to decide which is the most advantageous to the railroad company, and within a short time the officials will know which tender is the best. Then the successful bidder will be announced, and work will be begun immediately.

SECRETARY HITCHCOCK AFTER SENATOR FULTON

Washington, July 15.—Open war has been declared between Secretary Hitchcock and Senator Fulton as a result of the Senator's recently published declaration that the Secretary is "in his dotage." Mr. Hitchcock is determined to get revenge and he hopes to be able, with the aid of his corps of special agents and secret service men, to unearth something in Mr. Fulton's record as Senator that will justify adding his name to Oregon's dishonor roll. The Secretary, in short, intends, if possible, to put Mr. Fulton through the paces that carried late Senator Mitchell to his grave.

The plan of campaign against Mr. Fulton, according to reliable authority, contemplates a scathing scrutiny of his record, both here and in Oregon, the Secretary believing that somewhere evidence can be found which will prove damaging to the Senator and which may justify his indictment later on. However, Mr. Fulton's record was gone over with a fine toothcomb at the time Mitchell, Hermann and Williamson were under investigation, but nothing was then found which would justify action in the courts.

That Mr. Hitchcock has long desired to secure Mr. Fulton's indictment is a secret. His private secretary on one occasion said:

"We'll land that man Fulton behind the bars yet," but nothing came of his threat and it is believed that the Secretary had given up his quest.

Mr. Fulton's declaration that "Hitchcock is in his dotage," should not have surprised the Secretary, but the publication of the statement and its circulation through the press of the country did arouse him, and he is now more determined than ever to square himself for the "insult," as he describes it.

WHAT NEW YORK WORLD SAYS OF DAN KELLY

The New York World has the following to say regarding Dan Kelly's running 100 yards in 9.35 seconds:

"A long, lank, red-haired youth of twenty-three, living in Portland, Or., has distinguished himself by three feats of physical prowess, two of which thirty years ago would have been called impossible.

"Dan Kelly is credited with running 100 yards in 9.35 seconds; with doing 220 yards in 21.15 seconds; with covering 34 feet 2 1/2 inches in the broad jump.

"For years old fogies in athletics held that it was and would forever remain impossible for human muscle to drive the human body 100 yards in ten seconds, just as turf conservatives called the two-minute trotter impossible and professors of physics denied that baseball pitchers could 'curve' a ball. Even after ten seconds became the record there were some who pronounced it the limit—and both parties were wrong.

"Running is the most natural and universal of all exercises. Yet it is probable that in all the ages that have passed and among the hundreds of runners who have lived their little day there has never been a man who could equal Dan Kelly's two feats of speed. There have been many runners naturally as swift, but it is science and training that break records."
