Harrisburg, Or., July 27.—A spark from the engine of a wood-sawing outfit lodged on the roof of a small building in the west part of town yesterday afternoon and burned rapidly, the roof being old and covered with moss. Hearing the fire bell, the citizens responded quickly and soon had the blaze out there being little damage done.

This city now has its curfew and fire bell hung in a galvanized iron tower 30 feet high. The bell was originally mounted on the balcony on the city hall, but was considered unsafe in that place, and hence the tower was erected just east of the hall.

PROCLAMATION.

Whereas, There was submitted to the electors of the state at the last general election as required by law an initiative petition for a proposed amendment to Section 2 of Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, giving cities and towns exclusive power to enact and amend their charters, subject to the constitution and criminal laws of the State of Oregon; and

Whereas, on the 25th day of June 1906 the Secretary of State in my presence as Governor of the State of Oregon did canvass the votes given for and against said amendment; and Whereas, it was ascertained and determined upon such canvass that there were 52,567 votes cast for said amendment and 19,852 votes against the same, and that said amendment received an affirmative majority of the total number of effective votes cast thereon and entitled to be counted under the provisions of law.

Now, therefore, I, George E. Chamberlain, as Governor of the State of Oregon, in obedience to and by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by law, do hereby make and issue this proclamation to the people of the State of Oregon, and do announce and declare that the whole number of votes cast in the State of Oregon at said election for and against said proposed amendment was as hereinbefore stated, and that said proposed amendment received an affirmative majority of the total number of votes cast thereon and entitled to be counted under the provisions of the constitution of the State of Oregon from the date of this proclamation.
