FULTON LOOKS AFTER SPRINGFIELD POSTMASTERSHIP

Investigates Merits of Candidates
Roberts and Dority During His
Visit Here—Says the Legislature
Should Elect Jonathan Bourne
Unanimously

United States Senator Charles W. Fulton left for the north this afternoon, after a pleasant day's visit in Eugene. The object of his present trip to Eugene was to look into the matter of the appointment of a postmaster at Springfield to succeed Jas. L. Clark, who resigned some time ago. There are two candidates for the position, F. E. Roberts and C. M. Dority. Mr. Roberts has been deputy postmaster under Mr. Clark for a number of years, and Mr. Dority is an old soldier and formerly an engineer. Both have out strong petitions for the appointment and their support seemed to be so evenly divided that Senator Fulton decided to make a special trip to Springfield to ascertain which candidate should receive the appointment. He spent a couple of hours in that city yesterday afternoon and looked into the merits of each candidate's claim for the place. It is not known which one met with the most favor in the senator's eyes, but it is thought the matter will be settled within a short time.

THE SENATORSHIP.

Senator Fulton visited the Commercial Club rooms last night and was informally entertained by the members. He discussed various things politically and in speaking of the election of a senator next year said: "If the legislature fails to elect Jonathan Bourne the direct primary law in Oregon means nothing. I believe that he will be elected and that there will be no contest. The legislature should elect him unanimously."

Satoll Hanne, aged 12 years, has received a \$1 prize offered by the management in the "Made in Oregon" fair held in Portland last May as one of the best essays written by school children. Do Reconnaissance Work—Have
Been in Southern Oregon Where
They Have Been Similarly Engaged
