PLEASURE RESORT BACK OF BUTTE

Included in Plans of Willamette
Valley Co.—Ideal Spot for Such
Place Between Butte and River.
Street Cars From Washington
and High Streets

The recent sale of the famous Natarium at Boise, Idaho, to the Boise Traction Co., controlled by the Rhodes, Sinkler & Butcher syndicate, the same people who are financing the Willamette Valley Co., of this city, brings to mind the fact that the local company, when it first began business in Eugene, announced that among other things planned was the building of a pleasure resort on the bank of the Willamette river back of Skinner's Butte. It is not known how soon the resort will be built but it is probable within the next two years. As the city grows the people are bound to have some sort of amusement place, in fact they need it now, and a pleasure resort behind the butte, if properly conducted, would seem to exactly fill the bill. The Willamette Valley Co. has a franchise for the construction of an electric railway, to the north end of Washington street and to the north end of High street, and it is probably the plan to build to the site of the proposed resort from both streets, forming a belt line. The company owns the whole butte, except the McMurphy residence property, and the land between it and the river, and there will be no trouble in securing the right-of-way for the trolley line from Washington and High streets to the proposed resort.

While plans for the resort have not been studied out, it is presumed that baths will be established, various amusement features installed and a band hired to furnish music. If the city grows as expected no doubt such a place as the Oaks at Portland will be built up.

The new owners of the Boise Natarium will expend \$30,000 in immediate improvements.

A RICH NEW STRIKE IN THE NORTH FAIRVIEW

Herbert Leigh, secretary and general manager of the North Fairview Mining Co., operating in the Bohemia district Saturday received from the company's mine a number of samples of the finest ore ever taken out in the district, a new strike having just been made. No assay of the ore has yet been made. But Mr. Leigh, who is a graduate assayer, estimates that it will run between \$25 and \$50 to the ton. He went to Portland Sunday, taking the ore with him, and will exhibit it to mining men there.

DEATH OF ROBERT MOODY CHAPMAN

Robert Moody Chapman was born in Jefferson, Maine, on January 21, 1835, and died at Florence, Oregon, at 1:30 p. m. on August 8, 1906, of heart failure.

Mr. Chapman was married on October 25, 1881, to Susanna M. Brown, who survives him. To them were born two children, George and Flossie, both of whom reside with their parents.

Funeral services were held Thursday, being conducted by Rev. L. R. Bond, and the remains were laid to rest in the Masonic cemetery. Members of the G. A. R. and a large company of friends were present to pay the last tribute of respect to the departed.

Mr. Chapman was highly respected and esteemed in the community where he has resided for the past three years.—Florence West.
