LOG CABIN

HOTEL BURNED TO THE GROUND

George Frissell's Famous Caravan-sary at McKenzie Bridge Destroyed—Little Was Saved and Effects of Many Guests Were Burned

George Frissell's famous Log Cabin hotel at the McKenzie Bridge pleasure resort was burned to the ground Saturday forenoon about 10 o'clock, the news of the fire reaching Eugene late Saturday night by telephone from Leaburg.

The only particulars of the fire that have yet been received here came by phone from George Moody, who drove to Leaburg and called up Geo. Croner, whose wife and son Charles were staying at the hotel. Full particulars are expected to arrive on tonight's mail.

According to Moody's story nobody was at the hotel at the time of the fire except Mr. and Mrs. Frissell and the fire had gained such headway before they discovered it that they were powerless to save scarcely anything. A sewing machine and a bed were about all that was taken out.

The guests at the hotel were all away fishing or up to the springs and none of their effects were saved. Among them were Judge and Mrs. L.

T. Harris, Miss Ida Patterson, Miss Myrtle Kays, Miss Ellen Green, Mrs. Geo. Croner and son Charles and some Berkeley people. The relatives of the Eugene people there sent additional clothing to them on this morning's stage.

The fire was caused by a spark from the chimney lighting on the roof. A strong wind was blowing at the time and the blaze was beyond control in a minute.

The hotel was built ten or twelve years ago by Mr. Frissell, who has conducted it ever since. It was one of the most popular stopping places on the upper McKenzie and was known to tourists all over the coast. The loss is probably \$2500, with only \$600 insurance. It is not known whether Mr. Frissell intends to rebuild the house or not.

BUT ARRESTED FOR HORSE STEALING

Earl Chapman, Aged Eighteen Years, Will Be Taken to Oregon City— Tells Straightforward Story and May Not Be Guilty

Earl Chapman, aged about 18 years, was arrested in Eugene Sunday evening by Sheriff Fred Fisk, charged with the larceny of a horse and saddle from a man named Ward at Clackamas, near Oregon City. The sheriff at the latter place was notified by telephone of the arrest and an officer arrived up this afternoon to take the boy back for trial.

According to the boy's own story, Ward sent him to Arleta with the horse and saddle to transact some business. While there another man who formerly worked for Ward claimed the saddle as his and took it away from him. When young Chapman returned to Ward and told him of the occurrence Ward sent him back with the horse and told him to get the saddle or he would have him arrested. The other man refused to give up the saddle and Chapman, fearing arrest, turned the horse loose and went to the Dalles. He came to Eugene about two weeks ago and has been staying with his mother, Mrs. H. E. Chapman. The boy appears to be honest and tells a straightforward story.
