ATTEMPT TO BREAK OPEN AX BILLY SAFE

Burglar Entered Department Store Last Night and Bored Hole Through Safe Door—No Goods Were Taken—Entered Through Rear Door

A bold attempt at safe cracking was made at the Ax Billy department store last night. Someone entered the store and bored a huge hole in the door of the safe but probably being frightened away left the job undone.

Frank Truman, one of the proprietors of the store, discovered that an attempt at robbery had been made during the night as he opened the store for business early this morning. He first noticed that the rear door of the store was unfastened but paid little attention to the fact, thinking that the matter of fastening it was neglected when the store was closed the evening before. But when he had mounted the steps to the office he discovered that the safe had been tampered with. A hole nearly an inch in diameter had been bored in the door and a steel plug where the key hole was located had been broken out. The safe is an old-fashioned one, unlocked with a key on the outside of the door, and this fact possibly prevented the crackman from carrying out his designs, not being acquainted with the mechanism of the lock, it being so much different from those on modern safes.

Officers were notified and Chief of Police Farrington and Officer Croner immediately began to work on the case. The latter is of the opinion that he saw the would-be robber emerge from the alley between Stern's grocery and Newland's store at five o'clock this morning. He was a tough looking character, and H. A. Renninger, who conducts the lodging house over Stern's store, says no such man stayed at his place last night, so the fact that he was coming out of the alley at that hour of the morning is alone suspicious. Croner shook the front door of the Ax Billy store a few minutes before he saw the man, and he thinks he was at work on the safe then, the shaking of the door frightening him away.

The proprietors of the store think that no goods were taken, as they have missed none. Entrance to the store was effected by way of the rear door, which was pried open with a crow bar or some other iron instrument. An attempt was made to pry open a window, but the mercantile evidently considered the door was easier.
