## SECOND ANALYSIS SHOWS WATER TO BE PURE

Local Physicians Find No Bacillus in Filtered City Water

Samples Direct From River and From Tailings Off of Filter Contain Few Colonies of Harmless Bacillus Subtiles—Official Report Later

The work of analyzing the samples of water taken from different points in the city by a committee from the Lane County Medical Society, consisting of Drs. Ira Bartle, Geo. Wall and J. W. Harris, was completed late this afternoon and the result of the analysis was the same as that made recently by Dr. Ralph Matson, the state bacteriologist. The water that had passed through the filters was found to be absolutely pure, containing no bacillus whatever.

Samples of water were taken from the following places:

At the pump, before the water reached the filters: first tap after the water had passed the filters; washings from filter; Home of Professor F. S. Dunn, Alder street; office of County Clerk Lee, court house; home of Dr. Bartle, West Sixth street.

The samples taken before the water reached the filters and from the washings or tailings from the filters contained a few colonies of bacillus subtilis, which are not at all dangerous.

The committee will at once prepare an official report of the analysis, which will be published by the Guard.

## FOREST FIRES NUMEROUS IN THE MOUNTAINS

Forest fires are burning in the mountains in various parts of Lane county, but as far as known no green timber is being injured. Geo. Kelly, of the Booth-Kelly Lumber Co., says there are more fires at the present time than there have been for years, but with the excellent fire patrol service maintained by the Booth-Kelly people and other lumber concerns the damage to standing timber is kept down to the minimum. The smoke in the valley is getting thicker every day. A good rain would help things out wonderfully.
