The Greater Eugene

That was good news for Eugene published in Saturday's Guard. In a broader sense it is good news for Lane county and the entire state to know that a railroad line will be hurried to completion across the mountains through the rapidly developing Klamath country and down into California. Oregon needs most of all better transportation facilities, and will grow in population and business volume by leaps and bounds when all the projected steam and electric railway lines, which have apparently good backing, are completed within the next few years.

Eugene's position as a trade center for the head of the great Willamette valley, surrounded by more standing timber of good quality, within accessible distance, than can be found in any like area in the world, with vast mineral wealth only just beginning to be sought for, and many square miles of the richest agricultural and fruit land in the West, is rapidly attracting the attention of moneyed interests. The Philadelphia financiers who are spending a fortune on water works and gas plant, and will invest another quarter of a million in an electric street and suburban railway, connecting this city and Springfield, are among those who realize the possibilities of the not distant future. Five years more will see a vast increase in the business and a population of the Willamette valley and the center of its activities will be located at Eugene, the most natural place to build the second city of the state.

A New York press dispatch sizes it up this way: Reference to the seven men of Wall street recently has drawn out numerous inquiries as to the identity of these mysterious men who control all business enterprises and almost control the political welfare of the United States. By common consent in the financial world the seven are John D. Rockefeller, J. P. Morgan, James J. Hill, James Stillman, George F. Baker, Jacob Schiff and E. H. Harriman. These seven men represent interests that cover every possible phase of business enterprise in America.
