Light and Water Problem

The Willamette Valley Co. is attempting to secure a franchise in Roseburg, where there is a great mix-up in regard to water and lights. The old company has refused to sell out, and the people have taken the first steps to install a municipal system. The Willamette Valley Co. promises the people all kinds of good service, but they have been fooled so often and suffered so long that they are not satisfied with mere promises and are anxious for some results. And there in the people are right, as the residents of Eugene and other valley towns can testify. All these corporations are profane of promises until they get the franchises and privileges they desire, and then it is always a case of "the public be damned."

There is but one way to settle a question, and that is to settle it right—and the right way is for the people to own their water and light systems. The Willamette Valley Co.'s policy seems to be to gobble up franchises for light and power plants and electric railway franchises in all the growing towns of Oregon and hold them indefinitely, for future use or speculation. This policy is being exemplified in the action of the company in securing an electric railway franchise in Eugene, apparently for the sole purpose of shutting out other investors, and showing no disposition to make good their promises, upon the strength of which many citizens, as well as the newspapers, urged the council to grant their petition.

The Roseburg people should profit by the experience of their neighbors. In an article written by Minister John Barrett, of Colombia, some good advice is given to American exporters as to the best way of increasing their trade with the Latin American republics. The total commerce of those countries aggregates annually about \$1,800,000,000 gold. Their imports are of the value of \$720,000,000, showing a remarkable advance in ten years. The United States exported to all those countries, in 1905, about \$182,000,000 worth of goods, and imported \$309,000,000. There is no reason for the continuance of this adverse balance of \$127,000,000 against the United States, as all of those nations buy largely of European countries, goods that are produced in the United States. Better transportation facilities is one thing greatly needed. A study of the languages and the sending of salesmen who can speak in the natural tongue of those countries is another thing needed. Mr. Barrett well sums up the situation, which should be studied by American producers.
