

COTTAGE GROVE
WILL VOTE ON
PROHIBITION

City Council Takes Advantage of New Law and Election Will Be Held Oct. 20--Extension of O. & S. E. Railroad--Coyotes Killing Many Sheep

The Cottage Grove city council met in regular monthly session last Monday evening. The mayor, recorder and all the councilmen were present except Councilman Johnson. An initiative petition for an amendment to the city charter giving the city a right to vote on local option was presented. The election is set for Saturday, October 20, 1906.

The work of grading the extension of the O. & S. E. railroad to Diston is nearing the finish, there remaining only between five hundred and eight hundred feet. The job is somewhat tedious, however, as it has to be done by hand with a shovel. The work is a shallow cut and there is so much gravel and boulders that a scraper cannot be used. The company is anxious to complete the grading before there is much rain. It was difficult enough to get men during dry weather, and after the rains set in it will be almost impossible to hold them.

A goat herder on the hills about the source of the Siuslaw states that he lost seventeen goats one night last week, which he lays to the marauding bear. More than likely he is mistaken as to bear. Cougars will kill more than they eat--seem to kill goats and sheep for amusement, and the destruction should be laid at the door of the great mountain cat.
