THIRTEEN-YEAR OLD BOY HAS DISAPPEARED

Jas. A. Hinton, of this city, is pretty badly worried over the disappearance of his 13-year-old son. The boy left his home on Friday of last week with the expressed intention of visiting one of his uncles in the vicinity of Elmira, taking his shotgun with him, intending to hunt pheasants on the way out. Mr. Hinton learned this afternoon that the boy had not appeared at any of his relatives' houses and at once began arrangements to look for him. As the boy has never been inclined to run away from home his disappearance is unaccountable and there are fears that he may have accidentally shot himself.

Walter Lyons has sold the West Side Enterprise, of Independence, to a man from South Dakota, and will retire from the paper.

The Royal Insurance Co. has pinned its faith to San Francisco by announcing the construction of a big building on a \$750,000 lot. This following the payment of nearly \$5,000,000 in losses.

The business men of Seattle on Monday subscribed over \$500,000 for the Alaska-Yukon fair, and it is said \$850,000 of stock will be sold in all. H. E. Reed, formerly of the Oregonian, is director of exploration and is proving a genius at the business.

The State Irrigation Association will meet in Hood River Oct. 11 and 12. The delegates from the Willamette Valley League are Hon. J. R. Weatherford and G. A. Westgate from Albany, G. A. Senator Jones of Independence, W. H. Hollis of Forest Grove, Chas. Hardy of Eugene, and Col. Hofer of Salem.

A dispatch from Seio to the Salem Statesman says an electric railway will be built in the near future connecting Seio with Salem, that from Seio the line will extend up Thomas creek and Crabtree, tapping the fine belt of timber there, of which heavy purchases have been made the past month.

Albany Democrat: Chief Farrington of Eugene does things. Yesterday he arrested Herman Breyer and Ryan Blachley on the charge of violating the local option law on separate charges.

A man from Drain says work is being pushed vigorously on the Coos Bay road. Within 25 miles of Drain there are ten big camps of graders. Among the big contracts are two for tunnels which will take 15 months and two years respectively to build. Work is going ahead in a manner to show that the road is a business proposition.

Several big commercial travelers were getting weighed at the depot this morning. They made the haul go up as high as 240. J. M. Woodruff leading the crowd. Then Dr. J. L. Hill, waiting to go to Salem to tell the boys some things about medical matters, remarked, "let me show you some corporosity," and whiz, the hand went up to 230, and the drummers took a back seat.—Albany Democrat.

Representative Virgil Carter, of Benton county, is contemplating a bill in the next legislature providing for a state auditor, an office that would do away with the graft investigating committees, junketing trips, etc., of the legislature, most of which are regular fiascos and accomplish nothing.
