

GRANT TEST SUES FOR BIG DAMAGES

Thursday's Oregonian has this about Grant Test, a former Eugene boy:

"Captain of Police Patrick Bruhn yesterday filed answer in the suits brought against him by Ernest Engel and Grant Test, who were arrested by Bruhn on the night of May 5 and charged with being pickpockets. The suits were released when they told their story to Judge Cameron. They then sued Bruhn for \$2500 damages. Bruhn declares that he arrested the men after a complaint had been lodged against them by two reputable citizens; that no undue force was used in making the arrest, and that the prisoners were given an opportunity to secure bail. They alleged they were locked up in a foul cell all night and refused bonds."
