He also hinted that he would be compelled to swallow another bitter pill when Oregon and Corvallis meet this season. It is almost an assured fact that the "Farmers" will stand little show against the "varsity" team this season. Norcross evidently remembers that famous Chicago-Michigan game last year, when Michigan was defeated for the first time for several years. Coach Bezdek, of Oregon, played full for Chicago in that memorable game, while Norcross played quarter for Michigan. The rivalry of that game has extended to the Far West.
