

CHANGE IN EUGENE BUSINESS FIRMS

H. Gordon Sells House Furnishing Business to F. L. Campbell and Jos. Fellman

New Firm Will Take Possession of Business on March First and Make Improvements Contemplated by Mr. Gordon—E. L. Campbell Sells Interest in the Guard Printing Company

H. Gordon, Eugene's largest house furnisher, has sold out his large furniture, carpet and house furnishing establishment, located at the corner of Eighth and Olive streets, in this city, to J. Fellman and E. L. Campbell.

While the transaction has just been closed, the new firm will not take possession of the business until the first of March.

H. Gordon started in the house-furnishing business in Eugene about seven years ago, and has built up one of the largest establishments of its kind in the state and is a thorough business man. Mr. Gordon has decided to move to Portland, where he will reside in the future. He recently purchased a fine business lot in Portland, but stated to a Guard representative that he is as yet undetermined as to what his future in the business world will be. Mr. Gordon will be missed in Eugene business circles, where he has played an important part of the upbuilding of the city.

The purchasers of the business are both well known in Lane county. Mr. Fellman is a business man of ability and holds large large timber and logging interests in western Lane county. Mr. Campbell is a member of the Guard Printing Company and has successfully managed the Guard's interests for the past four years. He has sold his interest in the Guard to other members of the firm, but will stay in his present capacity on the Guard till a successor for his place is found.

The new firm announces that it will follow Mr. Gordon's conservative policy, but will make several important improvements contemplated by him.
