Shirk and Francis V. Galway will be representatives in the debate, and J. R. Latourette and two members who are as yet unselected will uphold the honor of the Laureans. Some phase of the municipal ownership question will be the subject.

One of the great interesting features of the battle is that each society feels it a victory over the other if one of their representatives captures the medal.

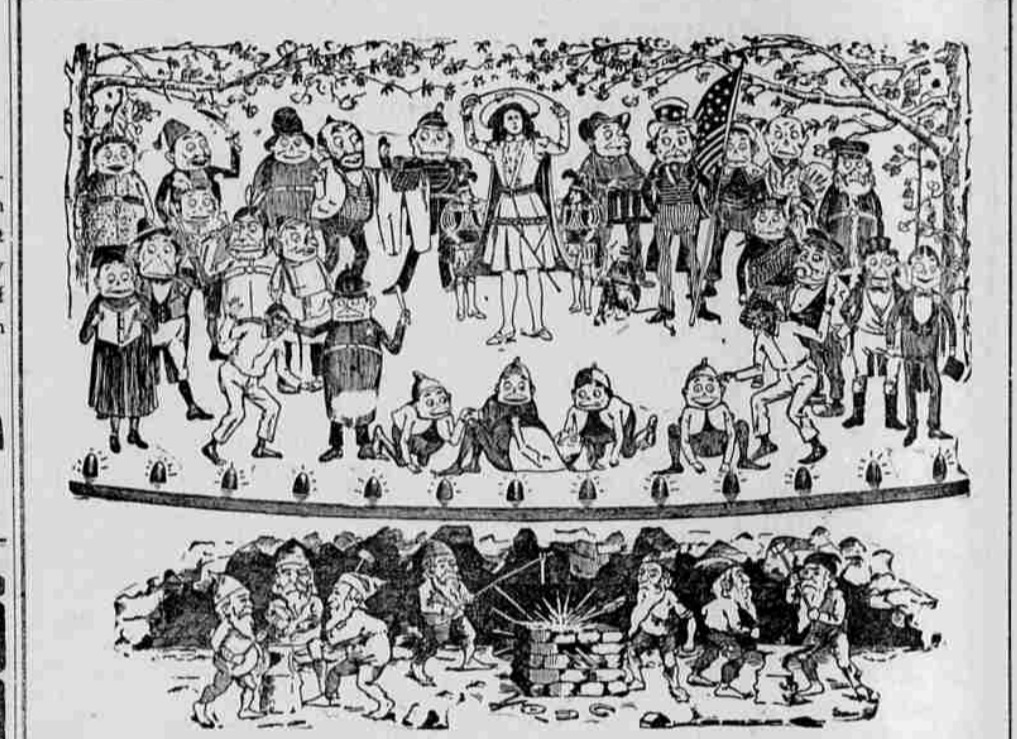
