BERT MUNN MAY ENTER THE U. O. GOES TO THE DALLES

Crack Oakland, California Athlete Wants to Train Under Bill Hayward—Has Some Fine Records

Albert Munn, the senior who will be turned out of the Oakland, Cal., high school in June, has his eyes on the University of Oregon, and may enter that institution, according to rumors from California. Of course, the Universities of Stanford and California are after that promising young athlete, and will offer him every inducement to enter their classic halls, says the Portland Telegram.

He is a man much to be desired, a valuable addition to any college team in the country. With a record of 11 feet 3 1/2 inches in the pole vault; 21 feet 10 inches in the broad jump; 6 feet in the high jump; 51 feet in the shot put; 165 feet in the hammer throw, and 16 4-5 seconds in the 120-yard hurdles, Munn does not have to go begging for recognition. He is a very husky chap, and carries six feet of first-class football material about him.

Trainer "Bill" Hayward, and the fact that he has developed the world's greatest sprinter, Dan Kelly, are probably the attractions that put the notion in young Munn's head. There is also the plan of Hayward to take an all-Northwest team to the Jamestown Exposition next year that may loom up as a very desirable jaunt to Munn. Then Zacharias, one of the tackles on the University of Oregon team this year, is from Oakland, and he and Hayward have been working to get Munn here.
