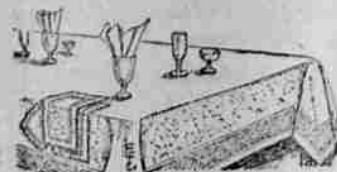

COURT STILL WORKING ON LIQUOR CASES

Jury After Being Out Until Late Last Evening Finds Emil Etter Guilty. Mayhew & Ware Case Tried Today and Beginning Made on Breyer Case

The trial of Charles Mayhew and Frank Ware, charged with violating the local option law, was ended today about noon. The evidence seemed to be stronger than in the Etter case, tried yesterday. The principal witnesses for the state were G. R. Shortridge, Steve Southworth, J. G. Griffin, E. B. Griffin and Wm. Elliott. Shortridge testified that he entered Mayhew & Ware's place on November 12 and called for a pint of ginger ale. He received a pint of whiskey, for which he paid 25 cents. The bottle of liquor was introduced as evidence.

Southworth testified that he had been in the defendants' place and called for ginger ale and got liquor. Elliott and the Griffin brothers testified that they had been in the place and called for drinks. The Griffins said they got something to drink but did not know what it was.

Charles Mayhew and Frank Ware, the defendants, testified that they never sold anything to either Southworth or Shortridge.

The jury in this case was as follows: R. McMurphy, F. F. Deming, Amos Wilkins, J. A. Clearwater, James Calvert, R. W. Newland, Geo. Spores, W. M. Green, J. M. Smigley, J. F. Minney, W. P. Cheshire, Mason Harwood.

At four o'clock this afternoon the jury had not agreed upon a verdict.

ETTER FOUND GUILTY
The jury in the Etter case returned a verdict of guilty last night about nine o'clock, after being out eight or nine hours.

Breyer Case is On.
The trial of Herman Breyer, on the same charge, began immediately after the Mayhew and Ware jury went out. Four jurors were accepted, but as the venire was exhausted it became necessary to take a recess until the other jury returned.

Divorce Granted.
Mrs. Maude Bell was granted a divorce from Phillip R. Bell by Judge Harris this afternoon.
