

SIUSLAW SALMON PACK LARGEST IN HISTORY

The fishing season just closed has been the best on the Siuslaw for 20 years, if not the best since the fishing industry was established here. This is no idle boast, but is shown by statistics that have been carefully kept since 1887, says the Florence West.

Previous to that time a cannery had been operated here for two or three years, and afterward the business of salting salmon was carried on here for several years, but no accurate statistics of the amount of fish packed are to be obtained. However, in the summer of 1887 three canneries were established here, and the business has been carried on every year down to the present time. This year there has been a cold storage plant and two canneries operated here, and they were unable to handle the fish as fast as the men could catch them.

This year Avery & Gibson, who operated the Hurd cannery, have packed about 7,000 cases. Wm. Kyle & Sons Co. have about 8,000 cases of canned salmon. At their cold storage plant this company have put up about 150 tierces, each holding 100 pounds of fish. In addition they have about 200 barrels of salt fish. Nella Christensen salted nearly 100 barrels of salmon and a number of other parties also have smaller quantities.

It is difficult to say what proportion of the exceedingly large run of fish this season is due to the work of the hatchery, as all the rivers up and down the coast for a considerable distance were greatly favored in this respect this year. Even on streams where no efforts at artificial propagation have been made, there is an unusually large catch. But there are two facts which indicate that a considerable proportion of the increase is due to the hatchery work: One is that until within two or three years past the efforts at artificial propagation have been confined almost entirely to the Chinook salmon. The other is that the number of Chinooks caught in this river has been steadily increasing in proportion to the other kinds of salmon for several years past, and this year the proportion is much larger than ever before.

ROSEBURG PLANT IS BOUGHT BY WELCH CROWD

Several weeks of negotiation terminated today in the expected sale of the Roseburg water and light system, by Guy A. Majors, to A. Welch to whom the city council recently granted franchises, and who represents the firm of Rhoades, Sinkler & Butcher, of Philadelphia, doing business in Oregon as the Williamette Valley Company, says the Roseburg Review. The actual consideration to Mr. Majors was \$30,000 cash. In addition to this price, the purchasers assume the bonded indebtedness of \$200,000 established when, on December 24, 1903, the two old competing systems were consolidated by Fred J. Blakely, the immediate predecessor and business associate of Mr. Majors. These bonds draw six per cent interest until the year 1921. Of the total amount \$65,000 worth of the bonds are held by Mr. Morris, of the Eastern firm of Morris & Whitehead, and the remainder is divided among Douglas county residents. Although possession of the system was given over to the purchasers today the purchase will date from November 1, 1906. The management of the business will pass into the hands of Mr. Welch's brother, both of whom, together with the former's attorney, C. L. McNary, of Salem, are present in this city.

Improvement Plans.
"We are going to greatly improve the water and light service in your city; our present plans in that direction involve an expenditure of about \$50,000," said Mr. Welch to a Review reporter today. "We have ordered a pump of a daily capacity of 1,000,000 gallons to displace the one of 350,000 gallons capacity now in use the Winchester plant. As soon as this new pump is in operation which will be fully four months yet the power plant in South Roseburg will be of no further use and will be abandoned. When the river at Winchester falls to a low stage, we will commence raising the dam there about five feet higher. This item alone will be an expense of not less than \$30,000. We already have on the way here a 200-horsepower dynamo, capable of generating three times as much electricity as is now furnished; a 400-horsepower Corliss engine for use when the water is low and a new lot of transformers. After the big pump is installed plans for duplicating the five-mile pipe line between Roseburg and Winchester will be drawn up and pushed to rapid consummation."

"Are you going to charge the rates under the old franchise or those under the one granted you by the city council?" the reporter asked Mr. Welch.

"While the purchase of the plant necessarily conveys the old franchise in conjunction, my company will charge the rates in the franchise granted me by the council," was the assuring reply from Mr. Welch. This terminated the interview.
