

CLUB ASKS FOR \$50,000

ADDITIONAL
One Hundred Thousand Dollars for Federal Building Thought to Be Sufficient---Free Locks at Oregon City and Open River to Eugene Discussed.

At a special meeting of the Commercial Club last night the question of an additional appropriation for the new federal building was discussed, and it was decided best to ask for only \$50,000 additional instead of \$100,000 as decided by the members of the Merchant's Protective Association. This would give Eugene a \$10,000 building. A committee of five as follows was appointed to draft resolutions asking for the additional appropriation and to confer with the Merchant's Association on the matter: T. G. Hendricks, R. A. Booth, S. H. Friendly, L. E. Bean and C. A. Hardy.

The matter of free locks at the Oregon City falls and the clearing of the channel of the Willamette for navigation as far as Eugene was taken up and discussed by prominent citizens present. A committee consisting of F. M. Wilkins, D. A. Paine, G. W. Griffin, E. O. Potter and F. L. Chambers was appointed to draft resolutions to be presented to Oregon's representatives in congress asking an appropriation for the work.

The annual banquet for club members will be held New Year's eve and a committee as follows was named to arrange for the affair: W. G. Gilstrap, C. B. Willoughby and F. M. Wilkins.
