

M' MURPHEY'S GAS PLANT AT ASHLAND

Robert McMurphey left this afternoon for Ashland, where he will make arrangements for the beginning of work on his new gas plant, a franchise for which has been recently granted him by the city. Mr. McMurphey informs the Guard that the plant will be large enough for a city of 10,000 people, about the same size as the Willamette Valley Company's plant in Eugene, and that it will be completed as soon as possible. The franchise calls for the completion of the plant on or before March 1, 1908, but it is expected that it will be in operation long before that time.

Mr. McMurphey says that the plant will be first-class in every particular, with the latest machinery and retorts, and he feels satisfied that he will be able to give entire satisfaction to the people of Ashland.
