COLONIZATION SCHEME FOR LAND GRANT

A great colonization undertaking is being organized by the new owners of the Oregon military road land grant, who have just paid the Booth-Kelly Company \$750,000 for a 12-mile strip extending from the summit of the Cascade range to the eastern boundary of the state, says the Portland Journal. They expect to begin this year by locating 500 families on the strip, and increase the number annually as the country is opened up and transportation facilities secured.

"What is the use of Mississippi farmers going to Canada to settle, when agricultural lands fully as good and better climatic conditions are to be found here in Oregon?" is the leading question asked in the campaign for settlers.

The purchasers are the Oregon Military Land Grant Company, of which the following are the officers: President, H. A. Hunter, Minneapolis; vice presidents, A. C. McGivray, Dickinson, North Dakota, and C. R. McHugh, Chicago; Treasurer, Andrew E. Johnson, Minneapolis; secretary, J. A. Hunter, Minneapolis; H. A. Young and John A. Young are in charge of the colonization plans, and the Beaver Realty Company will be the Portland headquarters of the concern.
