

**DAN KELLY WILL  
COMPETE IN ONLY  
THREE EVENTS**

Trainer Hayward Will Allow Champion Sprinter to Enter Only Broad Jump, 100-Yard and 220-Yard Dashes This Spring - Big Meet May Be Held Here

Dan Kelly next spring will not try to do as much as he did last year on the track, when he ran relays, made high jumps, broad jumps, ran the 100 and 200-yard dashes. Hayward will keep him to just three events, the broad jump and two sprints, the 100 and 200-yard dashes. At one meet last year the wonderful sprinter sank from exhaustion, while at others the great number of events in which he participated undoubtedly decreased his powers in the others. The whole institution wants to see him this year do better than he did last, so it is considered advisable to hold him to three things.

This will not lower the strength of the track team, for there is lots of good material in the events which Kelly has dropped. Just the full extent of this new material cannot of course be determined until the men get out and work more consistently.

In March the Freshman and Sophomore meet will be held. Fred Moulton, the pole vaulter, is captain of the Sophomore team and Dodson, a Baker City distance runner, will head the Freshmen.

**Big Meet in Eugene.**  
Hayward considers it very likely now that a meet between the winner of the Stanford-California meet will be brought to Eugene and the Pacific coast championship fought out here. The expense will be about \$500, which surely could be easily met. To have such a meet come off in Oregon would be very gratifying to the supporters of the university, and if arrangements can be made there is no good reason why it should not be brought about.
