PRUNE CULTURE IS VERY BADLY NEGLECTED

H. S. Gile, of Salem, Thinks Small Fruits Do Not Receive Proper Recognition - State Horticultural Society Criticized

Salem, Jan. 18.—That the State Horticultural Society has lost sight of all other fruits in its admiration and enthusiasm for the apple is the opinion of a number of fruitgrowers who attended the annual meeting last week. And some of the growers are angry about it.

Alex LaFollette, the well-known grower of peaches and loganberries is one of these. H. S. Gile, the prune man and manager of the Willamette Valley Prune Association, is another. Mr. LaFollette came home from the meeting in disgust before it was over. He wanted to hear something besides apples. Gile stayed the meeting out, but is up in arms against what he considers an attempt to limit the term "horticulture" to apple culture. With fire in his eye he thus addressed a newspaper reporter Saturday:

"I should like to ask of you, sir, what is the meaning of the term 'horticulture'? It appears that the officers of the State Society of Horticulture have narrowed the term down until it takes in and absolutely excludes everything else but apples, chiefly Hood River apples.

"A large number of members of auxiliary societies attended this meeting with the hope of learning something of the hope of learning of berries of various sorts, peaches, pears, prunes and other fruits. Apples by no means constitute the only, nor do they constitute the chief fruit product of this state. Take the Oregon prune for instance; to my mind it is by far the most valuable commercial fruit product of the state of Oregon today, and can be grown more successfully over a greater area of the state than can any other fruit, and yet the prune is practically barred out from the discussions, crowded out, or at least is unrecognized by the so-called 'Horticultural Society.' Yes, I have repeatedly tried to bring the prune into notice and into favor with the officers of this society, but with indifferent success.

"I have come to believe, sir, that a new word will have to be coined to cover the various fruit interests of Oregon, as 'horticulture' evidently applies to apples at this date. There are men in the Willamette valley who are making more money today per acre on loganberries than is produced in the best orchards in the state on apples. There are men I am convinced who are making an equal success on well located orchards of Oregon prunes, and there are thousands of acres of hilltops, or rolling lands throughout the state that should today be planted to prunes, Oregon prunes, to meet the demand which will certainly come within the next ten years for a greater supply of this product than can be produced on the sure-bearing orchards which are now in existence and yet this most valuable of all our fruit products is compelled to stay under cover at the meetings of the so-called 'Horticultural Society.'"

Ex-Governor Pardee Makes Sensational Speech in Bay City.
