HEAVY DAMAGE BY STORM ABOVE COTTAGE GROVE

Falling Trees and Landslides Put Oregon (Securities Co. in Bohemia Mines Out of Business. Wildwood Lumber Co. Loses 275,000 or 300,000 Feet Logs

The late storm at Bohemia is reported to have been the most severe of any that before has been experienced by observers there now. One or two trees were blown down and fell across the flume of the Oregon Securities. A land slide let the water out of the race and put the electric plant out of business. The stamp mill in turn was silenced. A tree or two fell across the tram between the mill and the Champion mine. Superintendent Eade at once put men at work clearing away the obstructions. The telephone wires are down so that the slower mail has to be relied upon for communication.

Log Boom Breaks.
The Wildwood Lumber Company on the line of the O. & S. E. R. R., lost quite heavily by the flood of the week before last, between 275,000 and 300,000 feet getting away when the boom broke. The loss is the more keenly felt for the reason that the logs were the choice of the entire fall's cutting. The boom was linked together with a chain made of inch iron rods and was thought to be strong enough to hold, but it was the anchor that pulled out, and at the lower end, too. Many of the logs lodged along the lower river, but the cost of recovery is more than the original cost, hence the company counts the timber a total loss.—Western Oregon.

USE MAPLE SHADE TREES FOR WOOD

With wood at six and eight dollars a cord following the cold, the Guard has a suggestion. There are hundreds of cords of wood about town that may be secured right on the premises at nominal cost to many, at the same time adding greatly to summer health and condition. We refer to the big maple shade trees that have overgrown and almost covered many residences, at least covering them so that the sun has no opportunity to warm and dry them out as it should.

Green maple limbs with a little dry wood to reinforce them, burn very well in the fireplace or stove. Get your ax and saw out, and if you cannot climb a ladder, get someone who can, and get rid of the unhealthy shade about your home, with the leaf nuisance in the fall. These trees are parasites, in a way, finally take strength from the very hands that have protected and cared for them for all their years. Still, you will find not a few people who would deem it almost sacrilege to prune these trees that, unconsciously to their owners, are most detrimental. Even if it turns warm this advice is good. Let God's sunshine shine upon you.
