Portland Market Report.

Portland, Or., Jan. 24.—Eggs are on the down grade, with 34 cents named in a majority of houses as the top of the market, and poultry tending to lower prices. Hens and large springs rule at 13 1/2 @14c. The milder weather started in supplies, known to have accumulated in the country, with a rush, and dealers say they expect larger receipts right along during favorable weather. Demand for live poultry is slow, but lower prices there is said to be prospect of a great improvement in the demand for mutton.

Country butter is in very good demand, several important houses being unable to fill orders this morning because of depleted stocks. City creameries report good active trade, with supplies of cream keeping up fairly well.

A Chicago trade circular has the following to say upon the position of hog products:

"Hog receipts at Chicago have been light for a year. Only two months of 1906 showed any gain over 1905, and the other ten months reported marked losses in receipts. The total Western pack for the year was a shade over 1905, but nowhere near large enough to keep pace with the demands of the country. Life at high tension requires pork products and the consumption is steadily increasing all over the world.

"The technical position of lard is regarded as especially strong. Western stocks are practically exhausted. The pure food law has stopped the making of stearine and oleo compounds to be sold as pure leaf lard, and the demand for the real article is therefore larger, apart from any general increase in lard consumption."

Livestock Market.
Light receipts marked the two days at the local yards. One load of cattle and a few sheep were handled promptly this morning, but fat hogs

have taken on a somewhat easier tone and the market is slow. One rather singular feature in hogs for the time being is that feeders are in better demand and bring better prices than fat stock. Light weights are also up 2@35c.
