**New Liquor Ordinance Went Into Effect This Morning - Can't Get "Ginger Ale" and "Cincinnati" Now Unless You Are Strictly On the "Inside".**

The new liquor ordinance went into effect this morning, and it is said that only those who are strictly on the "inside" can now obtain "ginger ale" and "Cincinnati" at the "soft drink" parlors. It is predicted by some that the ordinance will have the effect of "rightening" things up for awhile, and when the "new" wears off that things will drift back into the same order that has prevailed for several months past. However, the officers declare that they intend to do their duty and enforce the law to the letter and will do all in their power to bring any violators to justice. One or two of the "soft drink" places were found closed this morning but later opened. It has been stated that several of them would go out of business, but so far only one, that conducted by E. Etter, has been closed for good. The room will be occupied by M. Svarverud's real estate office.

**Numerous Drunks.**  
Yesterday being the last "day of grace" there was considerable celebrating, with a consequent rush of business in the police court this morning. Several drunks and hobos were jailed by the officers last evening. W. D. Miller, lately from Beaverton, was found by Chief of Police Farrington lying on the ground near the vinegar factory "all in." When he became sober enough to talk he stated that he had been robbed of \$45 and a gold watch, but this morning Judge Dorris assessed him \$20 and he has written to Beaverton for the money. F. J. Schofield, the chemical man, spent the night in the lockup and was too sick to appear when court convened this morning. A fellow called "Rosey," whose real name is not learned, deposited \$30 for his appearance this afternoon. He is a recent arrival here, and it is said he is worth \$30,000. Four hobos who were run in were released this morning and sent out of the city. There were numerous other drunks in town last night, but they succeeded in avoiding arrest. "Rosey" appeared in court this afternoon and was fined \$20. Schofield is still unable to appear.
