Sheriff Fisk Submits His Final Report on 1905 Assessment Roll—Taxes Delinquent Only on Property Owned by Non-Residents

Sheriff Fisk late Saturday afternoon submitted to the county court his final report on the 1905 assessment roll of Lane county. The report shows the best collections in the history of the county, which indicates a very prosperous condition of the people. The property on which taxes are delinquent belongs mostly to non-residents. The report is as follows:
