

**RIVER HIGHEST  
SINCE FRESHET  
LAST MONTH**

The river is higher today than it has been since the freshet early in January, but it is not yet out of its banks. The gauge on the red bridge showed a height of nearly thirteen feet this forenoon, but the water seems to be stationary. There has been plenty of rain, which if it had been warm would have caused the river to rise to a flood stage, but no snow is melting, and consequently the rise is very slow. Four more inches of water in the Willamette would cause it to flow over the road north of the bridge. There is no drift wood afloat, indicating that the river is not out of its banks above here. The slough in the south part of the city which overflowed and caused so much damage during the recent freshet, was bank-high this forenoon, but has gone down some during the day.

able and comprises some of the best timber in Coos county. Those controlling it have no desire to dispose of it, notwithstanding the explicit terms of the grant.  
This is where Senator Malarkey comes to bat. He has prepared as measure reproducing the terms of the grant and arranging for legislative action whereby the land must be disposed of at \$2.50 an acre, as the government intended. Naturally, this measure cannot be expected to meet with the entire and complete approval of the land holders.  
Under Malarkey's measure every citizen of the United States, male or female, who is 21 years old, can buy up to a quarter section of this donation on payment of \$2.50 an acre. This is, of course, providing that the aforesaid citizen of citizenship has not already bought timber land, in which event the applicant can only purchase enough to make up the balance to complete a quarter section.

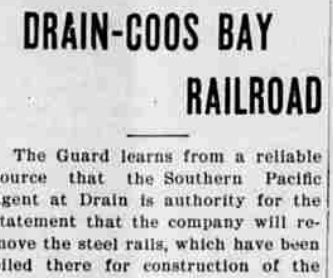
