SMALL CLASS OF APPLICANTS FOR CERTIFICATES

Only Fifty-One Persons Present Themselves at Teachers' Examination Today - Eight Men and Forty-Three Women - Three for State Papers and Others for County

The smallest class of applicants for teachers' certificates since County School Superintendent Dillard has been in office and, in fact, for several years previous to the time of his election, is taking the examination at the courthouse. Only 52 presented themselves this morning, whereas a class of from 75 to 90 is the average. Of these 48 were applicants for county certificates and three for state papers. As usual, the feminine sex predominates largely, 43 of the applicants being women and eight men. Superintendent Dillard is assisted in the work by W. G. Martin and Miss Esther Devereaux.

UNIVERSITY BILL PASSED SENATE TODAY

Salem, Or., Feb. 13.—Eaton's bill appropriating \$125,000 annually for the support of the state university, passed the senate late this afternoon without amendment. It had previously passed the house and is now up to the governor for signature.

SUE S. P. CO. FOR RUNNING OVER CATTLE

Scharen Brothers, Farmers and Dairy-men, of Creswell, Ask for Damages in the Sum of \$375.

S. A. Scharen, J. A. Scharen, and W. J. Scharen, partners in the farming and dairying business in the vicinity of Creswell, today instituted suit in the circuit court against the Southern Pacific Company for \$375 damages for the killing of nine head of cattle and the maiming of seven head by one of the company's trains.

The complaint, filed this afternoon by the plaintiffs' attorneys, Thompson & Hardy, alleges in substance as follows: That the company failed to maintain and take care of its cattle guards on either side of the county road crossing the railroad between Goshen and Creswell, and caused and permitted the same to be filled with dirt and gravel so that the guards would not turn cattle or prevent them from going across the guards onto the railroad track; that on or about September 2, 1906, while the cattle guards were in that condition the company caused a train of cars to be operated over the track in that vicinity at a high rate of speed, and that the train ran over and killed nine head of cattle and maimed and injured seven head; that the nine head were worth \$300 and the damage to the seven head was \$75; that the plaintiff duly presented a claim to the company for damages, according to custom, but the company refused to pay the claim.

The plaintiffs ask, besides the \$375 damages, \$100 attorney fee and the costs and disbursements of the suit.

TELEGRAPHIC BRIEFS

Ex-Governor Frank W. Higgins, of New York, died last night at Olean, New York.

As the result of a determined fight by Senator Kay, of Marion, the senate has ordered a reduction of \$12,500 in the annual appropriation asked for the Oregon Agricultural College. The present standing appropriation for maintenance is \$25,000 a year. A bill was introduced by Senator Johnson, of Benton, for an appropriation of \$50,000 a year, the law to take effect with the beginning of 1908, but Kay's determined opposition defeated it.
