The city council met last night for the purpose of listening to the proposition of the Warren Construction Company as to the cost of street paving, but as Mr. Shannon, the representative of the company, did not have all the specifications with him the meeting, after the transaction of some minor business, adjourned till this afternoon at 4 o'clock.

Last Night's Meeting

At the meeting last night Attorney A. C. Woodcock, representing the Willamette Valley Company, asked that the personal bond of \$5,000 given by A. Welch to ensure the carrying out of the street railway franchise be substituted by a bond to be given by the company. It was moved and carried that the company present its bond for consideration.

Ordinances

An ordinance ratifying plat of Gross' addition was passed.

An ordinance establishing grade of Summit avenue and one for grading the same and taxing the cost to property owners was passed.

Other Matters

The matter of candidates for the city election came up, and it was decided that candidates be required to file their petition not later than March 20.

The city attorney was instructed to reduce to writing the contract for fencing Hendricks' Park.

The marshal was instructed to notify those who put in street curbing to do so according to the ordinance. A bill for \$129.25 for expense of council's trip to Portland was presented and an order drawn for its payment.

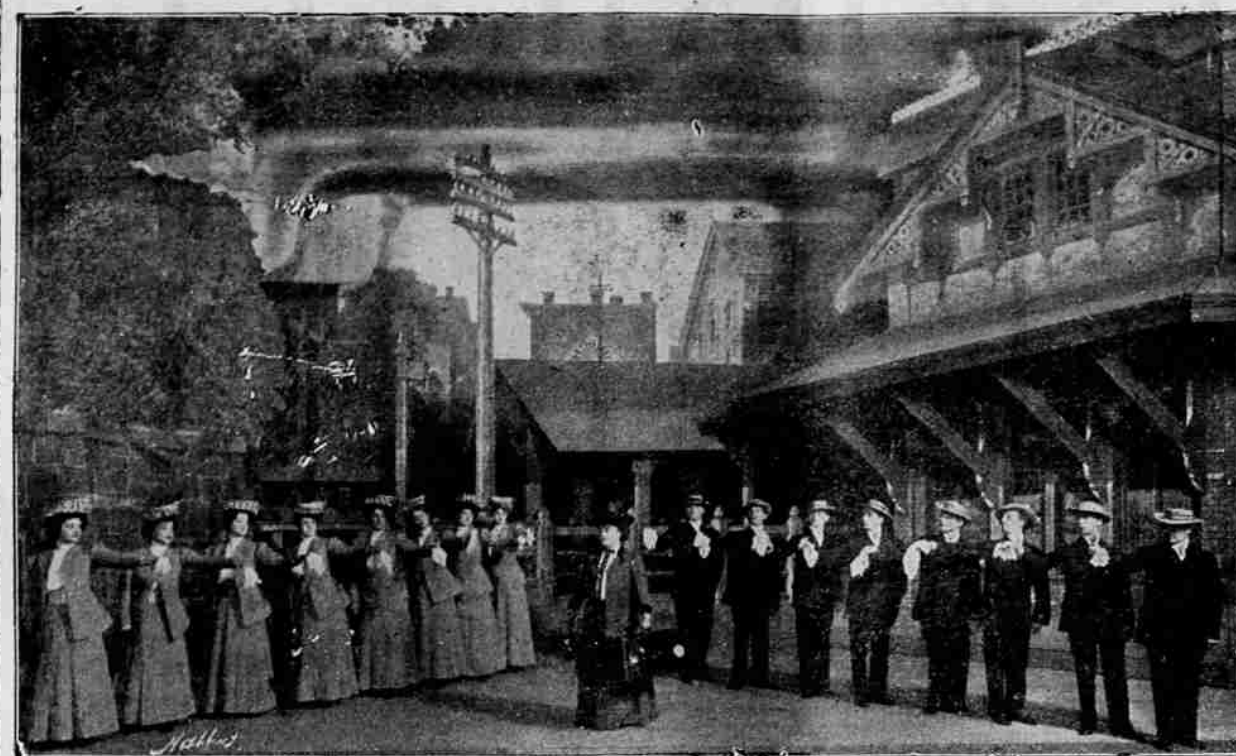
