

MATLOCK ACCEPTS NOMINATION FOR MAYOR

Municipal Ownership Forces Name Him As Their Standard Bearer in Present Campaign - Meeting Held at Court House Last Night and Rousing Speeches Made

As predicted by the Guard, J. D. Matlock was nominated for mayor at the mass meeting held by the municipal ownership forces at the court-house last night.

The meeting was largely attended and enthusiastic. R. M. Ray was chosen as chairman, and Jesse G. Wells as secretary. After the object of the meeting was stated the chairman announced that nominations for mayor of the city were in order and the names of J. D. Matlock, S. D. Allen and C. S. Frank were proposed. It was announced that Mr. Matlock had expressed a willingness to accept the nomination if it was the desire of the people, and the other two candidates withdrew their names from the convention. Mr. Matlock then received the unanimous vote of the meeting. A committee consisting of T. H. Garrett, C. S. Frank and J. J. Walton was appointed to call upon Mr. Matlock, who is ill at his home, and inform him of his nomination. They did so this morning and the nomination was accepted.

Campaign Committee.

The following campaign committee was appointed: J. J. Walton, chairman; W. W. Calkins, from the First ward; W. S. Moon from the Second ward; W. E. Smith, from the Third ward, and L. P. Horton, from the Fourth ward.

Addresses were delivered on the issues of the campaign by F. J. Berger, J. O. Watts, I. N. Harbaugh, T. H. Garrett, J. J. Walton, Dr. W. L. Cheshire, W. G. Martin, Rev. C. A. Woolley, W. S. Moon and others.

The Two Tickets.

There are now two complete tickets in the field and the campaign is on. The tickets are as follows:

Municipal ownership—For mayor, J. D. Matlock; for councilmen, T. H. Garrett, J. O. Watts, I. N. Harbaugh and F. J. Berger; for recorder, B. F. Dorris.

Citizens—For mayor, F. W. Osburn; for councilmen, M. Svarverud, Frank N. McAllister, G. W. Griffin and Geo. G. Gross; for recorder, D. L. Cartmell.
