

U. S. QUIETLY PREPARING FOR TROUBLE

Establishing Recruiting Stations for the Army in All Cities of Any Size - Eugene Office Has Already Enlisted Several Men Who Will Be Sent to the Philippines

That Uncle Sam is preparing for trouble in the Far East is plainly shown by the establishment of recruiting stations all over the country, wherever there is a company of the national guard or a city of any size. Moreover, the men who are now recruited are at once sent to the Philippines, while they were formerly enlisted in the regiments in this country. The establishment of stations in the towns has been made so as to attract as little attention as possible, for though the government may be preparing for trouble it does not want to be known as making extraordinary efforts for enlistments.

The office here is located upstairs in the Cockerline & Wetherbee block at Eighth and Willamette streets, and has been open for about three weeks. Just the full extent of the success of Sergeant Weed here has not been told, but it is said that five or six men have quietly enlisted. The men recruited in Oregon go to Vancouver first, but inside of three or four days they are sent to San Francisco, where they take the first steamer to the islands.
