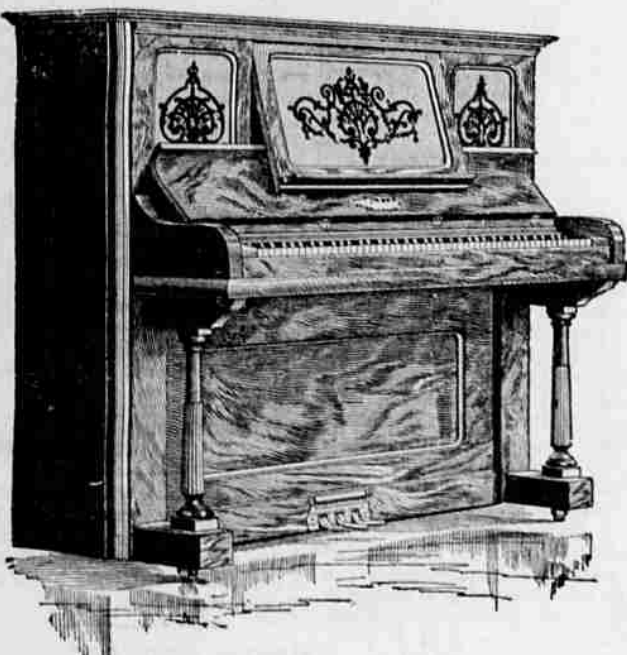

WILL ADD TWO STORIES TO BUILDINGS

J. B. Coleman Writes That He Will Be Here Soon to Arrange for Beginning of Work to Enlarge His One Story Bricks - Will Be Largest Three-Story Block in City

Two more stories will be added to the one-story brick buildings occupied by Julius Goldsmith's and Lee Hoselton's cigar stores and the shooting gallery on Willamette street this summer, making the largest three-story business block in the city.

John B. Coleman, owner of the buildings, who is now residing in San Diego, Cal., removing there three of four years ago for the benefit of his health, has written to his agents here stating that he will arrive in Eugene in less than two weeks to arrange for the work. Plans for the addition have not yet been completed, but it is the intention to build of reinforced concrete, which has come to be a popular kind of building material in the larger cities, especially those in California, and which has only recently been introduced in Portland.

The buildings which will be thus added to cover a space 50x114 feet in dimensions. The fronts will be remodeled, and when the improvements are completed the building, if it will be one then, will be one of the largest in the city, as well as being the largest three-story structure.

Mr. Coleman says he will divide the two upper floors into sleeping rooms and will perhaps conduct a lodging house, although he may lease the rooms to the Smeede Hotel, as that caravansary is often crowded. The prospective growth of the city with the advent of the street railway and the paving of the streets will make it necessary for the hotel to enlarge and these lodging rooms will come in handy for that purpose.

SPECULATION ON RESULT OF TRACK MEET

Since the final arrangements as far as setting upon a track meet with Stanford is concerned have been made for May 3, a great deal of calculating on Oregon's chances has been done, and figures from Stanford are being perused very carefully when obtained. Stanford, it is understood, will bring fifteen men here, but no idea is had as to just how they will be distributed. All of the regular events in the Northwest track meets will be contested, and besides the two-mile run will take place. At Stanford they do not have the discus, but the two-mile race instead, and as Oregon does not have this event both will have to be tried in order to make the meet as fair and even as possible.

Stanford is said to have a much better balanced team than Oregon, and that being the case Moulton, of the Californians, will undoubtedly try to discern Oregon's weak points and make up his team accordingly. But right there will be a hard task for the foxy southern trainer, for Hayward, Oregon's trainer, is equally versed in such little schemes, besides having a greater advantage. Stanford's men will be in condition a month before Oregon's, and in spite of every precaution facts will slip through. On the other hand Oregon will not have her team anywhere near selected, outside of a few stars, before a week previous to the final date.

Is Oregon Stronger?

No one knows here if Oregon's team is stronger than last year, for though Friessel graduated and Lowell, Mitchell and Prideaux are all out this semester, there are a lot of new men who may fill up the lost men's places.

Oregon will have to look out for surprises, too, for in Neal and Holman Stanford has men who can run the hundred in ten seconds flat, and Kelly himself is some racer does no better than that. These two men are also good for some very fast time in the 220, and as Vandervoort can jump well up into the small numbers of the twenties Kelly will have to be in very good form to win first place in those three events. In the hurdles McFarland and Peaslee are men who can do as good as any Oregonian has ever done, as are Nash, Maundrell and Bradford in the distances. Stanford also has fine men in the pole vault and high jump, capable of 11 feet 4 inches and 5 feet 8 inches respectively.

PASSENGER TRAIN SERVICE STILL WORSE

No Overlands Operating Except Nos. 11 and 12 - Big Breaks in Tracks in Northern California Caused By Floods - No Trains Last Night and This Morning

Southern Pacific passenger train service is now in a worse condition than at any time since the storms in the southern part of the state and in California began a few days ago. The rivers in the northern part of California are all flooded, and at Sacramento and Stockton the streets are veritably streams of water, and in the latter city some of them are six feet deep. No passenger trains except Nos. 11 and 12 and the Cottage Grove local are running. No overlands left Portland last night for the reason that there was no rolling stock there with which to make up a train and Nos. 13 and 15 were cancelled. No. 11 left the city on time this morning, and arrived here at or near the schedule time this afternoon. No. 12 was made up north of the break in the track south of here and sent through on time.

At Castella and Lomone, in Northern California, the worst trouble is reported and one stretch of 1000 feet of track is said to be missing at Castella, where the river bed at one place is said to be 25 feet deep where the track was. No business can pass that region for a week or more, though large forces are at work repairing.
